Municipal News

YARDS— Yard waste bags will continue to be picked up. Bags must be paper, and no more than 50 pounds. Branches must be tied together at lengths no more than 4' long. If bags are left out in the rain, and the bottoms fall out, it will be up to the homeowner to clean up and rebag.

The Peace Officers will be around the beginning of June to assess yards. If yards are unsightly with items or overgrowth, or if buildings are in disrepair making the area unsafe, notices will be delivered.

WATERING— Watering hours are in force year round. Residents with underground systems can only water during the night. Above ground can water between 7 pm and 12 noon. Watering in the heat of the day is not productive, and not allowed.

COUTTS DAY— Coutts Day weekend is June 19-21. The theme for the parade is "Fairy Tales". We are looking forward to some creative floats. Poster with the weekend events is attached.

SENIORS WEEK— Please come out to the "Seniors Coffee" on June 5, 10 am in the Civic Centre. Poster attached.

TAXES— Taxes will be mailed/emailed around June 24th, and are due August 31st. If you don't get yours please call the office.

Village News – Brown bag pickup started on May 5th, and it's nice to see all the work residents are doing to clean up their yards. June is a busy month in Coutts. On June 5 from 10:00 am to Noon, during Seniors Week, you can come down to the Civic Centre to hear presentations from our local RCMP and ATB as they give talks focused on preventing fraud against seniors. June 19 to 21 is both Coutts Days and the CouttsGrass Rodeo. FCSS is organizing Family Play Day on May 26th. This is a drop in event at the school for parents/caregivers and their children ages 3 – 10, from 9:30 to 11:00.

Rec Board – At the May meeting, we approved a 9-hole mini golf course to be placed inside the fencing north of the tennis court. The materials have been ordered and then some assembly will be required. We think it will be a fun addition and something that can be used by people of all ages. One basketball hoop will be taken down but the two on the west side will stay and the area cleaned of tree debris.

Village Council – We discussed the budget for next year, and there should be only minimal tax increases this year due to rising costs. Overall, the Village is in a good financial position, and we will do our best to keep it that way. There will be some paving and sidewalk scheduled for this year, and all that work will be covered by grant funding.

NEWS FROM CHIEF MOUNTAIN REGION SOLID WASTE SERVICES COMMISSION (better known as CMRSWSC) from Tanya Smith (board member)

With Spring in full swing and yards being cleaned up I have been happy to see so many residents using the brown compostable bags meant for yard waste, leaves, weeds, branches, etc.

It is important that organic yard waste like grass clippings and the above mentioned items do not end up in the landfill.

The best way to take care of that waste is by using the bags, and not filling up your black garbage bin (which gets picked up on Wednesdays) with these items. These items weigh a lot, and it is not necessary or good for them to be added into regular garbage.

There is a limit on weight for a landfill, that is calculated on a yearly basis. When that limit is reached, garbage is diverted elsewhere, at a cost, to the landfill, and ultimately to the tax-payers.

So thank you for all you are doing to keep organic yard waste out of the landfill and into a compost heap at our local site.

On May 6, 2026 I attended the **FCSS** meeting by zoom:

- ~Presentation from Big Brother Big Sisters
 - 40% increase in usage in 2025
 - which is a 35% increase since 2019
 - 384 children
 - Includes 9 communities, excluding Lethbridge County
 - 173 kids in 2026 so far
 - Plans to bring the Big Brother & Big Sister program to Milk River & Coutts
 - The program receives funding from a variety of sources, including FCSS. They appreciate the collaboration & relationship.
- ~Cheers to Volunteers 2026 presentation
 - Introduced the Youth Winners
 - Group Winners was My City Care
 - Individual Winner - Reta Berte
 - All nominees received certificates of appreciation.
- ~Smile Cookie Campaign was a huge success!
 - Team Coaldale sold 7592 cookies & raised the highest funds at \$16,575.65
 - Team Taber sold the most cookies at 7728 cookies & raised \$15,603.10
- ~FCSSAA updates were given.
 - FCSS turns 60 in 2026 & celebration plans are in motion!
- ~2025 Annual Report was presented.
 - Some adjustments were made to descriptions & terms, changes will appear in the 2026 report
 - Received staff updates including practicum students
 - May 4th is Mental Health Week
- ~We are still waiting to hear if we qualified for the FRN grant funding.

On May 21, 2026 I attended the Ridge Country Housing meeting in Milk River:

- ~Our bookkeeper's financial report was given.
 - Our balances are up from this time last year. We are waiting for some funds to arrive.
 - All requisitions have been received.
 - We received the owed emergency funding.
- We have some large maintenance projects coming up.
- ~We decommissioned the 6 small rooms. They will be used for offices, emergency use & talking to ALA about their use in the Lodge Access Agreement.
- ~ We have been told we do not qualify for the small lodge grant as it is a legacy program. We are looking into it further.
- ~Still working on payroll system changes.
- ~ Working on computer file updates for Prairie Rose.
- ~New handbooks have been reviewed & approved!
 - New Resident Handbook
 - New Employee Handbook
 - New Contingency Plan Handbook for Ridge View.

May Committee Highlights

Coutts Fire and Rescue

The Department responded to five emergency calls this month. Prompt response to the Thompson fire north of the village is credited for limiting fire damage to out buildings and preventing spread to the homestead and valuable feed stocks stored nearby. Crews also responded to the electrical outage accident and a MFR response rescuing an individual with both legs caught in a farm auger..

Discussion was held on the use of Google and Apple maps as aids in locating rural properties during emergency calls. Recent updates to both software programs enable inserting the rural "blue sign" addresses resulting in accurate directions to rural properties as obtained from "911 Dispatch".

The Coutts fire personnel will host firefighters from Shelby, Cutbank, Sunburst, Conrad, Chester and Browning in a social highlighting relationships gained through mutual aid, training and equipment access. The explosion in cost of foam used to fight vehicle, electrical and wildfires has led the department to install and begin usage of metering devices when mixing the foam to water; resulting in a major cost saving. Discussion followed on EMR/MFR training and recruitment of new long-term personnel to the department.

Heritage Handibus Association

Riders for 2026 to the end of April totalled 312; a 36% increase over the same period in 2025. Member registrations now stand at 80 serving a base exceeding 150 individuals. Registrations grew by 10% in the month of April. 40% of registered clients are 80+. The total number of riders handled in April was 91. The Heritage Handibus AGM was held May 13th. Auditing of 2025 financials was performed by Avail Chartered Accountants. The 600% growth in ridership resulted in a modest operating deficit. Committee members remain committed to the sustainability of this growing and important community service. It is the hope of the committee that community interest in sponsorship of the service will materialise in 2026. Letters will be distributed to potential sponsors in hope of attracting additional funding that would help minimize fee increases to our riders and aid in operating sustainability and capital asset procurement.

The Provincial Assisted Transportation Program has grown to 34 participating community services around Alberta. Healthy Aging Alberta manages this program. We have been participants since September 2024.

Coutts and District Library

The new chairs are in place around the library tables. They look great and are very comfortable. Many thanks again to the Friends of the Coutts Library for providing these welcome additions to the library. The library board has voted to have summer operating hours remain unchanged. It is hoped that having Wednesday remain open from 10:30 am to 1:30 am will help facilitate children's programs through the summer months. Chinook Arch has many fun kits available to participating libraries and Kari intends on utilizing this service. Keep up the great work, Kari.

The new television is in service with Chinook Arch supplied "Kanopy" programming available for viewing. Programs and movies are available for all age groups and are certified for viewing in Public Libraries. Bill 28 passed on May 13th allowing the provincial government to begin developing regulations for what are widely acknowledged by the Coalition of Alberta Public Libraries as unnecessary to the Libraries Act. Impact to our Village Library operations will remain unknown until the new regulations affecting access, use and borrowing of public library materials based on age are incorporated into the Provincial Library Act.



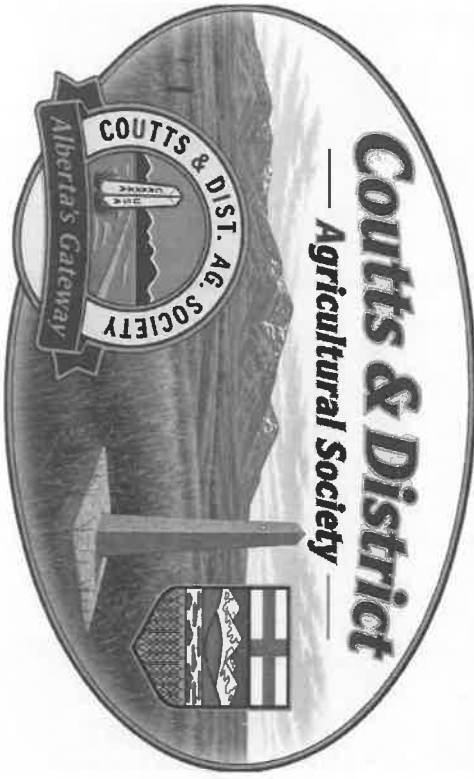

The Coutts & District Agricultural Society Objectives

1. The objective of the Coutts & District Agricultural Society shall be to encourage improvement in agriculture, horticulture, homemaking and the quality of life in the agriculture community.

3. To sponsor an exhibition on Coutts Day in June at which prizes will be awarded in agriculture, horticulture and/or homemaking classes.

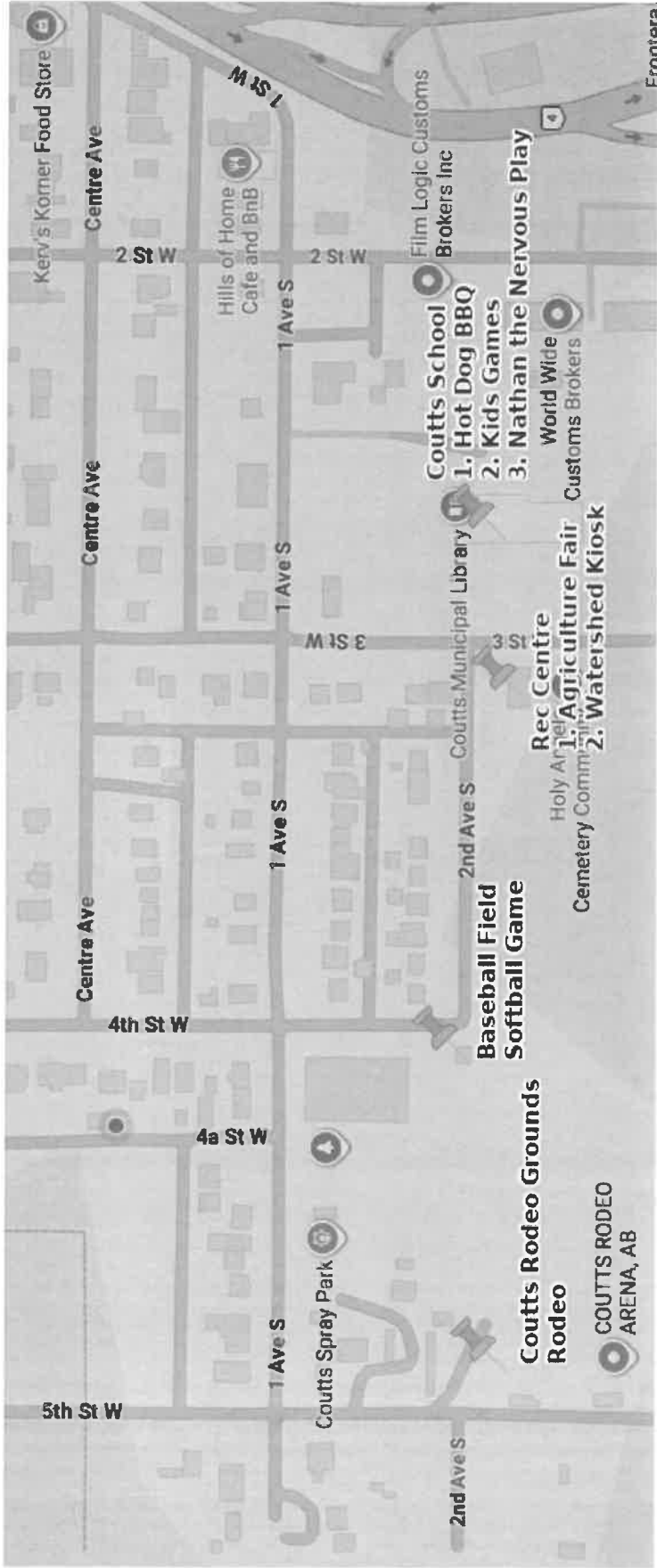
