<u>Vehicles-</u> It looks like plowing season is finally knocking on our door. Please move any vehicles/ trailers etc that are not in use off the street. This makes plowing easier and prevents ice from building up.

Taxes - If you have not paid your 2025 property taxes by the end of December, there will be a 12% penalty applied to your account on Jan 1, 2026. In January 2026 we will once again be offering a 5% discount on any amount paid towards your 2026 property taxes, based on the 2025 tax assessment. If paid in February, the discount will be 4%.

<u>Utility</u> prepayments for residential owners will also be offered in January. The prepay amount will be \$445.50. The prepayment is available only in January.
