Quad Municipality Healthcare Support Committee – We had a regular meeting on February 2nd. We completed a week of selling Kinsmen Corvette tickets over the Christmas holidays. Early in December we distributed food trays throughout Milk River to recognize our local healthcare workers. We don't have any further updates for a new doctor other than there are still 2 doctors being considered. We hope to get another update from Alberta Health Services soon. Our next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, March 2nd in Milk River.

Southgrow – On February 23rd, I participated in a zoom workshop to help come up with a 3 year strategic plan. Southgrow is an economic development alliance of 28 south central Alberta communities committed to working together to achieve prosperity for the region. 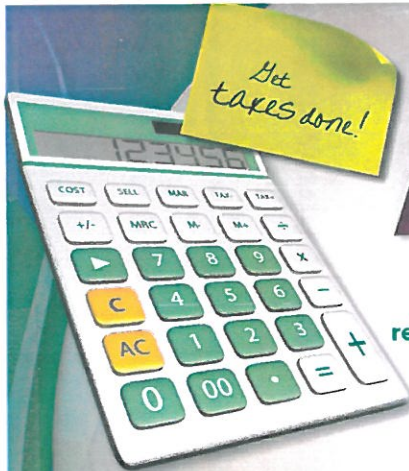

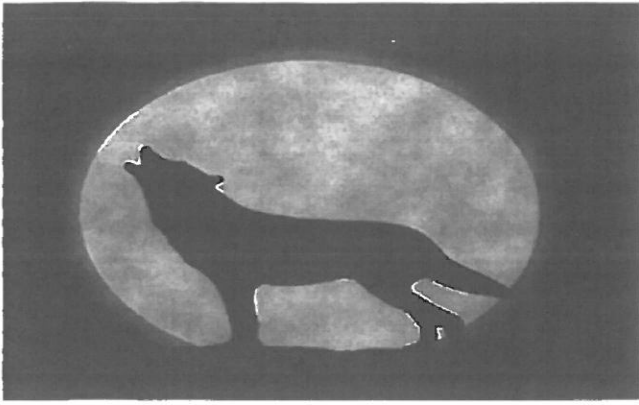
